


About RAHMA

RAHMA works to find practical and innovative approaches to uplift the lives of vulnerable people through healthcare, emergency relief, water aid, sanitation and hygiene, education, skill development, and nutritional support.

These approaches encompass the developmental activities during disasters and other vulnerable situations where the lives of children, men, women and livestock are threatened.

RAHMA Is a confederation, based on society and the contributing stakeholders working together, alleviating the sufferings of people by creating a just and caring environment, suitable for development of all, regardless of religion, race, ethnicity and cast



RAHMA Strategic Goals

Goal 1: > Health for all

akistan is a country where the investment on health sector in rural areas has always been scarce. Difficult topographies, mountains, deserts and extreme weathers have kept the facilities away from rural dwellers. It is a fact that reaching out to every part of country is not easy for Government; therefore RAHMA devised a plan to fill the gap. The strategy is a gradual build-up of missing health infrastructure, rehabilitation of damaged health facilities and provision of quality affordable health services to vulnerable groups all across Pakistan and Azad Kashmir.

Goal 2: > Emergency assistance to vulnerable

etween 1994 and 2013, EM-DAT recorded 6,873 natural disasters worldwide, which claimed 1.35 million lives or almost 68,000 lives on average each year. Pakistan is one of the most prone countries to natural and manmade disasters. As of now, millions of lives have been lost along with the heavy infrastructural damage. Complementing the efforts of Government, donor agencies, NGOs, community and other stakeholders in the fight against disasters, RAHMA planned to play its role through emergency assistance activities. With the support of donors, RAHMA is always ready to help disaster affected people all across the country.

Goal 3: > Education and skill development of deprived

n Pakistan, the most unfortunate sector is education which is in terms of investment and policies. There are ample number of schools opened across the country yet quality of the education is still the unachieved benchmark. Awareness regarding importance of education is explored by those, having already an educational background. In such scenario, most of the children having no educationally inspired family roots are either discouraged to get education or kept unaware of the importance of education. Most of such children belong to the category of street children and children living in slums. Anecdotal estimates of Wikipedia says that in Pakistan, around 1.2 to 1.5 million are the street children, involved in begging, work on daily wages and are involved in unethical/criminal trades which expose them to exploitation. Figure was cited 10 years ago and therefore, it is expected to have crossed 2 million which makes Pakistan one of the countries having largest population of street children. RAHMA being in its capacity targeted the street children by taking the flotilla of their education under its administration. RAHMA also builds the skills of deprived communities to thrive their lives up to the standards. RAHMA plans to identify street children and to provide them basic education facilities through schooling, psychosocial support, financial aid and skill development. It will also help them in social inclusion.

Goal 4: > People drink safer and live safer.

eteriorated availability of clean drinking water and unhygienic practices in rural areas drove RAHMA to provide them clean drinking water. Goal is to reach out to vulnerable communities all across Pakistan to provide them clean water aid and equip them with best hygiene education.

Goal 5: > Improving the nutrition of destitute.

amine, poverty and other disasters have made most of the rural areas more prone to nutrition deficient community. People especially women and children die due to insufficient food and other required nutritional edibles. Our goal is to provide them food; nutritional support and agriculture assistance helping them grow their own crops.



RAHMA HOSPITAL KHUIRATTA, DISTRICT KOTLI – AZAD KASHMIR


In 2010, RAHMA established its first health facility with the help of community and donors. It was a small building which was constructed to provide basic healthcare facilities to the people living in far flung topography of Khuiratta in Azad Kashmir. Gradually the scope of the project enhanced from one Union Council to another with the cooperation of development agencies like USAID and RAHMA Islamic Relief Fund. Not only the scope enhanced but massive improvement in the building and services were also materialized.



Project targets 2 union councils however due to quality services; people from other areas also visit the facility to avail health services. A small basic health center has now been transformed into semi-tertiary health care facility.

People who used to travel for miles to avail costly basic health services are now being given affordable and accessible healthcare at their doorstep. Provided services includes the availability of doctor/lady doctor, laboratory, labour room, emergency care, ambulance and outreach services.

This year RAHMA hospital Khuiratta provided healthcare services to 5,888 people who are direct beneficiaries. Apart from regular services, outreach activities were also carried out that includes medical camps, health screening camps and awareness raising sessions in different schools and colleges.

ACTIVITIES - RAHMA HOSPITAL KHUIRATTA

Awareness Sessions

o ensure preventive measures against the most prevalent diseases in the area, RAHMA under the administration of RAHMA hospital Khuiratta organized 3 awareness raising sessions. These sessions were given at degree college for boys, Government school for girls, and at the house of local community member. Among 485 individuals, awareness regarding prevention of prevalent diseases was raised through practical demos, one to one counseling, check-up and referral to hospitals in case of any treatment required.







Mother and childcare services

n few months, 7 children were born at RAHMA hospital Khuiratta. Labour room services have recently been started for 24 hours. RAHMA believes that every mother and baby deserves the best care possible – before, during and after the newborn enters the world. To ensure the best care, RAHMA involves the best available staff with expertise to provide pre and post natal care through standard procedures.

Blood grouping and screening camps

uring the year, RAHMA organized blood grouping and screening camps in different schools and colleges in the premises of Khuiratta. 263 students studying at Government degree college for boys and Government school for girls at bandli (a small hamlet) were facilitated with the screening and blood grouping camp. It was an alarming situation that out of 263 students, 5 were found positive against hepatitis. Affected students have now been referred for the treatment.





n the year 2016, 2 major medical camps were organized at RAHMA hospital Khuiratta in which specialists from international hospitals participated and provided their services to patients free of cost.



orld's famous orthopedic surgeon from England, Doctor Maqsood Abdali who always have been part of RAHMA philanthropic activities conducted his medical camp at RAHMA hospital Khuiratta and provided expert diagnosis and treatment to people of Khuiratta.



oreover, A team of expert doctors including cardiologist, eye specialist, gynecologist and medical specialists from Shifa International hospital conducted free medical camp. Patients who were diagnosed against severe diseases were referred for intense treatment at SHIFA International hospital and were advised for regular follow-up with RAHMA doctors at RAHMA hospital Khuiratta.

In these camps, RAHMA facilitated around 300 patients.






RAHMA HOSPITAL SEHNSA, DISTRICT KOTLI – AZAD KASHMIR

In March 2016, RAHMA established another semi-tertiary healthcare facility at Sehnsa, district Kotli, Azad Kashmir. It is a large town connecting with different small villages having population around 135,000, located at 8 miles to the west from the city of Kotli. Though it is a Tehsil, yet quality healthcare remained its problem over the decades. Complementing its goal for health, RAHMA established hospital for the people of Sehnsa.

The project targets the entire Tehsil and provide quality affordable services. It is one of the areas where availability of qualified doctor and lady doctor is an issue which was fairly solved by RAHMA by introducing qualified lady doctor along with male doctor, LHV and labour room. Hospital's laboratory is only one in the area having latest equipment with qualified staff. To take care of emergency cases, availability of ambulance has been ensured for 24/7. As of now, RAHMA hospital Sehnsa has provided health facilities to over 7,989 people. Highly qualified staff and quality health services on cheapest rates are features highly attracted by the community.

Reaching out to community is also a featured part of the health project which ensures the community to take care of their hygiene and take precautionary measures to stop the prevalence of diseases on their own. In 2016, RAHMA also conducted several medical and health screening camps in which, specialist doctors from Islamabad participated. Along with camps, doctors conducted multiple awareness raising sessions by going to the door steps of community members.

ACTIVITIES – RAHMA HOSPITAL SEHNSA - 2016

Free sugar diagnostic camp

AHMA hospital Sehnsa is newly established health facility. It has started working in 2016. Along with other activities, RAHMA hospital Sehnsa organized sugar camp for one week. Doctors felt the need of sugar screening after high turnover of sugar patients. 113 patients were facilitated in this camp. Camp was not limited to RAHMA hospital but also RAHMA staff conducted its activities in different schools.





Medical camps

AHMA hospital Sehnsa organized one medical camp. Apart from other activities, doctors are also concerned about patients, suffering from such diseases which requires the expert opinion from specialist doctors, such as, cardiologist, orthopedics etc. In this camp, specialist doctors participated from SHIFA International Hospital Islamabad, PIMS Holy Family, and Foji Foundation hospitals. These doctors facilitated 168 patients and referred some of them to regular treatment at SHIFA.



Mother and Childcare sessions

vailability of qualified lady doctor was one of the biggest problem at Sehnsa. RAHMA, after the establishment of its health facility, also hired the qualified lady doctor. Outreaching to the doorsteps of community is one of the mottos of RAHMA maternal and childcare department. In this regard, 2 sessions were conducted by the lady doctor at community provided venues. In these sessions, awareness regarding the importance of mother and childcare was compassionately delivered. In these sessions, 57 women participated.




RAHMA HOSPITAL JANPUR, DISTRICT RAHIM YAR KHAN – PUNJAB

RAHMA hospital Janpur is another contributor to RAHMA goal for health "health for all". After the massive floods in 2010, when most of the areas in South Punjab vanished from the land, RAHMA played an active role. RAHMA did not only provide the food to needy but also considered the need of state of the art health facility at nearest location to flood prone areas. Bigger cities are more balanced in terms of the availability of quality health services however the people of rural areas remain deprived from such necessities. Janpur connects to the flood prone areas of Rahim Yar Khan and is far below the average in the access of quality healthcare.


On the donated land by community, RAHMA constructed a state of the art semi-tertiary hospital in 2014. Within 2 years in Janpur, the hospital has tremendously improved and provided quality healthcare services to over 14,279 people. Considering the potential, Japan Embassy equipped RAHMA hospital with latest machinery, digital X-RAY Machine and fully equipped ambulance. 24/7 available male/female doctors, labor room, latest laboratory and hardworking staff have been up to the services for community in 2016 as well.



In collaboration with other organizations, beneficial activities also have been carried out which includes, hand washing campaign and first aid training of staff. Moreover, doctor/lady doctor conducts regular visits to schools, colleges and doorsteps of community members for awareness dissemination.



Affordability remained a constant attraction for the community. Moreover, free services are being provided to 30 non-affording families. This year RAHMA hospital Janpur benefited 14,279 patients with its services.





ACTIVITIES – RAHMA HOSPITAL JANPUR

Medical camps

o facilitate more of the poverty stricken people, RAHMA hospital Janpur organizes free medical camps off and on. This year 3 medical camps were organized at RAHMA hospital Janpur in which 735 poor patients were facilitated. All services were provided free of cost. In these camps specialist doctors, having expertise in gynecology, cardiology, orthopedics, child specialties, Skin and dentistry participated. Out of three camps, one totally focused on Eliza based sugar screening.









Awareness regarding breast cancer

very year, one million women are diagnosed with breast cancer. Breast cancer is the most common cancer among female and has become very common disease among women in Pakistan. It is more prevalent due to illiteracy and unawareness. This year RAHMA Hospital Janpur conducted 2 awareness raising sessions on breast cancers, its symptoms and prevention. One of the session was conducted at Government high school for girls and the other session was organized at RAHMA Hospital Janpur. In the second session, local female community members, social activists and school/college teachers were invited. In these sessions RAHMA disseminated the awareness regarding breast cancer among 500 females.

Blood grouping at Government school

AHMA Hospital Jan Pur team conducted free blood grouping at Govt. Boys College Khan Bela. In this activity, blood grouping of 317 intermediate students was conducted. Meanwhile RAHMA team also delivered health awareness session and briefed the students about the importance of blood grouping, personal hygiene and preventive measures against prevalent diseases in the area.

ALLAH DITTA – HEALTH IS EQUAL TO IMPROVED ECONOMY



sixty years old male patient named Allah Ditta came to RAHMA hospital with complaint of contact dermatitis for the last three years. During the course of time, he visited several hospitals but all went in vein. He is farmer by profession, and contact dermatitis hindered his work which was the only source of his family income. He faced extreme difficulty while performing his work in the fields. Couple of months ago, Some of his family members referred him to RAHMA hospital Janpur, where he received treatment for two months. Gradual improvement, utmost care and proper medication built his confidence at RAHMA hospital and he continued his treatment.

ow he has almost recovered from the disease lasted for three years. He said "Doctors at RAHMA are very passionate about their work and provide extreme care to patients. I am extremely thankful to doctors who helped me recovering from three years old diseases just in 2 months".








SATH – SCREENING, AWARENESS AND TREATMENT OF HEPATITIS IN AZAD KASHMIR

epatitis B and C are global health problems. There are 350 million Hepatitis B carriers worldwide, and going by the figure of 5.8% prevalence rate, there may be around 8 million Hepatitis B patients in Pakistan. Medical experts associate the fast increase in Hepatitis cases to ignorance and a lack of appropriate preventive measures.

ery recently a village Prem Kot in district Muzaffarabad Azad Kashmir has been identified where more than 25% of the village population is suspected to be infected by hepatitis B and (or) C.

It is an established fact that hepatitis B and C are

spread by infected hospital equipment, shaving equipment; equipment used in beauty parlors, and through junk food makers. The eradication of the disease is only possible if the root cause of the disease spread is reduced by taking important steps. In this scenario it becomes very necessary to educate the healthcare workers, barbers/workers at beauty parlors and other individuals about their role in the spread of disease.







aking a leading step, RAHMA with the help of University of Azad Kashmir and Government health department jointly executed a pilot project named as SATH "Screening, Awareness and Treatment of Hepatitis". In this project, RAHMA screened 7015 student and faculty members from University of AJK Muzaffarabad out of which 184 individuals were found positive against the hepatitis. Government health department played the pivotal role by pledging the treatment of individuals, found positive. RAHMA also conducted awareness sessions in and out side the university. Affected individuals are now being treated and Pakistan are receiving their education. It is an alarming individuals provided 184 positive cases which is 2.6% of the sample population. These positive cases are from all over AJK and some are from Pakistan. Given graph is the graphical representation of infected people with respect to their locations.



RAISE A HAND FOR HYGIENE

n 2016, to cater number of increasing patients of diarrheal diseases, a panel of doctors with management of RAHMA decided to launch a hygiene campaign. Idea was to reduce the prevalence of diarrheal diseases through awareness raising sessions among the children, and through hygiene related activities. RAHMA targeted children of 7 Government boys, and girls' schools.

he doctors along with the outreach staff of RAHMA Islamic Relief conducted hand washing activities and awareness sessions. In this campaign over 3000 students were provided awareness on daily hygiene practices, and how to get prevented from disease through hand washing

and other hygiene related practices. Hand washing demos were also part of these sessions, where proper hand washing technique was demonstrated to the audience. In the end of these sessions free Soaps were provided to the students.

t was an initiative taken by RAHMA Hospital Jan Pur along with the collaboration of Helping Hand for Relief and Development (HHRD).

ertificates of Appreciation were also distributed among all staff members who worked hard and contributed their energy in creating such activities.











INSTALLATION OF HAND PUMPS

AHMA has always aimed at reaching out to people suffering from water scarcity. As of now, 45000 people have been provided with clean drinking water with the help of generous donations and institutional funding. In 2016, RAHMA installed hand pumps in AJK and Rahim Yar khan for the vulnerable people, identified by the local notables. RAHMA also constructed water wells for the people of Tharparkar – the area facing drought like situation for last couple of years. Tharparkar has not been in the mainstream of development initiatives for decades, therefore being one of the other issues, unavailability of clean drinking water also remained un-highlighted. Considering the need, RAHMA conducted need assessment and proposed integrated solutions to national and international organizations. Through water initiatives, RAHMA benefited around 2000 people in past year.















RAHMA SLUM BASED MODEL SCHOOL (SBM)

hile understanding the need of spreading the education among out of school children and to have them included in social strata, RAHMA established a school with in slum area. The SBM School started educating the children of a slum of Ratta Amraal in Rawalpindi at primary level in April 2011. Later on, adult literacy classes and technical education were also introduced for parents and adolescent girls who could not attend regular school. These interventions have considerably improved the socio-economic conditions and behaviour of the slum-dwellers. Initially, the slum was comprised of gypsies who earned a living through begging, prostitution or menial labour. Education was not a priority among this community. Thanks to this project as children are now in school and the parents do not force them to beg.

Currently, 95 students are being facilitated at RAHMA Slum School. These students are enrolled from Class nursery to class 5.

RAHMA VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTER GULPUR – AZAD KASHMIR

here are around 400 families of Kashmiri refugees living in district Kotli - some in camps and other in different towns and villages. These refugees are still facing difficulties and their life is miserable. Majority of them are poor labourers and have no full time jobs for their survival. Poverty is rampant in their camps and colonies and many of the refugees families are living below the poverty line.

eing in the area since 2010, RAHMA brought into its consideration, the welfare of poverty stricken refugee girls and established vocational training centre in 2012.

he objective of this project is to contribute to poverty reduction among Kashmiri refugees by enhancing their vocational skills for improved income generation. As of now, 15 batches of 437 students have been trained in dress making, cushion making and embroidery. The target is to provide training to 500 students.





Her father was a laborer on daily wages. Almost 12 years ago, he went out in the quest of work and did not return back. No one knows that where did he go. They are not sure whether he is alive or not. Time passed on and Anum's family condition continued getting economically worst.

AHMA vocational training center provided her opportunity not only to build her confidence but also to play her role in the income generation for her family. After completing her course, she started sewing clothes of the females residing in the premises of her house. Her mother is now happy and feeling relaxed as Anum has started sharing her burdens.

num says "I will utilize my skills in a more passionate way by providing voluntarily, the sewing and embroidery training to more deprived girls at RAHMA vocational training center". She further added "RAHMA vocational training center might not be very attractive to people living in bigger cities but it has changed my life".
