



CASE STUDY

Dermatosis is the generic term given to any disease of the skin. Plurally it is referred to as 'dermatoses'. This term should not be confused with dermatitis, which is an inflammation of the skin.

Skin diseases are usually caused by infection with viral or bacterial organisms. Another reason for skin diseases is that it can occur due the imbalance in the physiological condition of the skin. Sometimes chemical agents may be responsible for skin diseases and allergies. If there is prolonged contact or contact with excess amount of strong chemicals, it can even result in poisoning. On the other hand, use of appropriate personal protection like gloves or overalls can help protect from developing skin ailments.

Patient with the same disease came to RAHMA Hospital Janpur. He informed that initially he took the disease very light and went to local quakes. Delay in proper treatment worsened the condition that caused him unbearable itching and pain. He considers himself fortunate to have attended one of RAHMA's health and hygiene awareness sessions in community that urged him to get his hands investigated by RAHMA doctors. He received treatment and within one week his hands were disease free as shown in the picture.

CASE STUDY

I am Muhammad Qasim from a very poor family living in slums of Ratta Amraal, Rawal-pindi. Couple of years ago, I along with other children used to beg on the streets of Raja Bazar. My daily earnings were around 100 to 200 PKR. I knew it was leading me to a horrible future. I wanted to study but my parents did not want. I used to play, abuse, and fight with other children all day long. One of my uncle wanted me rob people in public transport and for that, I once made a failed attempt.

I still remember that hot summer day when a person came to me smiling and gave me 10 rupees and said "My son, I am not giving you these 10 rupees for your begging. This is your gift and if you want to become someone who can give such gifts to other children, come to my school and bring your parents along".

He was principal of RAHMA Model School who next day convinced my parents not to send me out for begging rather had me enrolled at his school which is providing education to out of school children living in slums and other areas.

Today I am student of class 3 and happy that now every morning I get up for school having big dreams in my eyes. I am totally changed now. My parents are not worried about my educational expense as at RAHMA School, everything is free including uniform and hot meals.

Thanks to my teachers and RAHMA My dream is to become scientist. Will you Help Me???






























RAHMA provides clean drinking water facility to communities either do not have access to water or else the available water is not fit for human consumption due to impurities. In 2018, RAHMA ensured access of water to **8000** people in need through installation of hand pumps, Solar pumps and filtration plants, Ro plants in District Zhob –Balochistan, Tharparkar – Sindh, Rahim Yar Khan – South Punjab and Gujrat – Punjab.














IN-KIND SUPPORT TO SLUM DWELLERS AFFECTED BY FIRE ERUPTION



RAHMA Islamic Relief provided home utensils to the dwellers of slum in Ratta Amraal, Rawalpindi. In this slum, there are around 250 – 300 small huts in which over 400 families are living miserably. These handmade huts are situated on the bank of drain water stream "Nala Lai". Families residing in Ratta Amraal slum are very poor and earn through begging.

In an unfortunate incident of sudden fire eruption in the slum burned around 40 huts including everything placed inside. RAHMA team reached out to the site, rescued people and provided urgent in-Kind support to affected families. Moreover, RAHMA helped them rehabilitating their huts as well.

CLOSING CEREMONY OF HEALTH PROJECT IN SEHNSA AZAD KASHMIR



RAHMA Islamic Relief is providing Semi tertiary healthcare services in rural areas since 2010. As of now, over 600,000 people have been directly or indirectly benefited through RAHMA hospitals and health projects.

RAHMA Primary Healthcare Project Sehnsa was also one of the projects designed particularly to address the needs of rural community, deprived of MCH services.

The project was initiated with the funding of Norwegian Agency for International Development as a mobile health unit targeting different areas of Azad Kashmir. Initially the project served Union Council Dhanwan – Bordering with India at LOC, and later on as a result of assessment, ongoing health services were shifted to Sehnsa, which is a semi rural area having MCH services entirely depending on local quakes.


RAHMA served the area with quality health services including the health of Mother and Child 24/7 for one year by establishing Primary Healthcare Center. The catchment population was around 250,000 out of which 40,000 were reached out through clinical and outreach activities.

Before RAHMA's intervention, there was no lady doctor available, and people used to travel at-least 3 hours to avail MCH services. RAHMA not only introduced qualified lady doctor in the target area but also laid the foundation of awareness raising forum on Mother and Child Health. The forum's management lead conducted several meetings with District Health Department for the collaboration in health related initiatives between RAHMA and Government but also emphasized the hiring of permanent Gynecologist at Tehsil Head Quarter Hospital Sehnsa.

Before the project phase out, RAHMA and District Health Department reached to a conclusive MOU to continue health services especially MCH component as RAHMA's legacy in the target area.

RAHMA handed over its equipment to District Health Department and phased out of the project in a decent project closing Ceremony.

SUFI NIGHT



RAHMA believes strong participation of community in its development initiatives. Therefore, the community for which RAHMA initiates different projects is always involved in project activities whether it is of professional, in-kind or financial support.

Last year, RAHMA decided to take its charity dynamics to the next level and stepped into professional fundraising by organizing a Sufi Night in Rahim Yar Khan. Local notables, philanthropists and community members were invited not only to enjoy Sufi Music but also to provide their generous support for RAHMA Mother and Child Health Center, Janpur, Rahim Yar Khan. It was successful event that raised considerable amount for charity purpose.

RIR has started focussing climate change and DRR from a couple of years to ensure communities are knowledgeable, skilled as well resilient to disasters and climate change. Health clubs formed at community level to raise awareness regarding environment protection, and volunteers motivated communities for mass level plantation during the seasons. Team in RIR Healthcare Centers is trained in emergency response while more than 500



community volunteers (in AJK & Punjab) are mobilized, organized and have know-how to perform as Emergency Response Teams.

More than 200 of them have also been trained in first aid and rescue in collaboration with government department, Rescue **1122** in Punjab.



RIR aims at reaching timely to save lives and assets of the people during emergencies and disasters. It provides socio economic and psychological support including:

Lifesaving support; first aid; provision of food & non-food items; RIR helps communities in rehabilitation and early recovery through agricultural support, water supply, sanitation, shelter and healthcare etc.

RIR focuses more on women, children, elderly and people with disabilities as they are always found the most vulnerable.







8,400 children and teachers were provided more than 1.15 million liters of safe drinking water as well as 115,200 water purifiers. (Flood emergency 2010)


97,032 persons (including school children) made access to safe drinking water via installation of 157 communal hand pumps/dug wells including 16 deep water wells

EDUCATION AND CHILD PROTECTION





RIR has been working towards promoting basic literacy among the ultra-poor and the most marginalized children and women in the society. It strives to ensure primary schooling for all boys and girls particularly but not limited to the children in slums, child beggars and the orphans through:

Setting-up or supporting schools in rural area, urban slums and sponsorships for orphan and vulnerable children in rural and urban areas, especially in urban slums. Education and psychosocial support to affected children during emergencies. Increasing mass literacy by establishing adult literacy centers.

696 children (mostly slum based including child beggars) accessed quality primary education.

RIR has also established a permanent school building for such children1

32 Temporary Learning Centers (TLCs) were established

8,432 (approx. **44%** girls) children were provided with educational supplies, play as well as early childhood development kits


290 committee members of 32 Community Protection Committees were oriented and trained to build local ownership of child protection activities
